Campsite planned for artists at Edinburgh Festival Fringe

A temporary campsite offering discounts to performers and allowing them to showcase previews of their work is planned for this year's Edinburgh Festival Fringe.

The site is planned by Campingninja, the company that created a pop-up site for the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow last year.

It is expected to hold up to 1,000 campers in 350 tents, but the exact site has not yet been confirmed. However, Campingninja director Rhian Evans told The Stage that the preferred site is Inch Park, two miles south of Edinburgh High Street.

The site, which is situated around a community sports centre, is intended to be open for the duration of the fringe, from August 7 to 31. The campsite side-steps any changeof-use planning requirements because

it is open for less than 30 days.

Campingninja is proposing to have a separate performers' area in the site, and will offer discounts for 12- and 24-day passes. However, Evans told The Stage that both the opening time and the duration of passes were open to change.

Evans said: "We put it out there to see what feedback we get, and if it is more sensible to do something in a different way, then we can change it. We will probably canvas opinion in some way on the website, so we can get a sense of whether people want to come earlier.'

The site will also have a breakfast stage where performers can showcase previews of their productions to early risers, according to Evans.
