Many of us can hum '90s pop group Steps' songs, but did you know one of the members is also a huge cat fan? Here Ian 'H' Watkins tells us all about his love of felines.

When 'H' - otherwise known as Ian Watkins, member of hit-making '90s pop group Steps - spoke to Your Cat, he was waiting to welcome a third feline into his family. Last year Ian took part in a highly successful Steps reunion tour and he has also starred in the stage musicals Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat' and 'Chitty Chitty Bang Bang' since the break up of the band. But, for now, his cats are a priority...

"I just love Exotics and was looking for the right cat for a long time," he says. "Now I can't wait to get up to the breeder in the Midlands and bring her home! She is just adorable, a silver spotted tabby shorthair. We think we're going to call her Megan as all our animals have Welsh names but we'll have to see if it suits her when she moves in!"

H was brought up in the Rhondda Valley and says that animals have always been part of his life. "I love anything with a heartbeat," he admits. "I have two brothers and my Mum never knew what sort of creatures she was going to find in the house, including a bath full of frogspawn!

"We did have a family cat and also a Labrador called Ben who was like another brother, as well as rabbits and guinea pigs oh, and I had a pet tarantula at one point..."

to a flat without one so Dylan and Hugo had to go to Wales to live with my Mum and Dad. Then, four years ago, I moved to the country with my partner and we have surrounded ourselves with animals. We have horses, dogs, chickens and ducks and we now have two cats as well.

"I did some research into cat breeds and their temperament and decided to look for Ragdolls because they are so affectionate - real lap cats. Our two are called Elin, after my partner's Gran who sadly passed away, and Sws (pronounced suss) which is a Welsh word meaning kiss or cuddle.

"They came from the same litter and look very alike, though they are quite different in personality. Sws likes to rub

her nose and cheeks against mine and is very vocal, telling us to love her all the time. Elin is quieter and will sit on my lap purring, and then lie on her back with her paws in the air to have her tummy tickled. She is the supermodel type, like a feline Cindy Crawford. Sws is more of a comedienne. beautiful but also funny like Anna Faris [actress]. They get on well with each other and with the dogs, in fact all four animals will sleep
