**Is being a role model to your fans something you're comfortable with or how do you feel about that title?**

**Do you enjoy working on other projects aside from your music?**

**Is being a judge on a reality TV show be something you would consider?**

I don't know; I would have to cross that bridge when I come to it. I did enjoy doing *The X Factor* because I love watching talented people. I think that's the exciting thing about being a performer you never know what's going to present itself.

**You have such a unique style in terms of your music and sense of dress; where do you draw your inspiration from?**

When I write songs different experiences and everything that I go through helps to fuel that spark. I've been writing for such a long time now and I think the older you get and the more experiences you have the easier
